Rationale for Proposed Name Change

Our annual exit interviews with graduating students (BA in English, Applied Language Studies Option) indicate that they find the name **Applied Linguistics** more transparent and clearer. Many were not aware what they might do as Applied Language Studies Option majors until they took a few classes. With the name **Applied Linguistics**, the program is more visible and less ambiguous in its goals. Moreover, Applied Linguistics as a discipline is defined by the Linguistic Society of America as "a broad range of activities which involve solving some language-related problem or addressing some language-related concerns." This is precisely what we prepare our students to do after graduation. The term **Applied Language Studies** is used with the same meaning by few programs. **Applied Linguistics** is much more common.
